Message from the Chairperson:

On Sunday, June 5, we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. I confess that for most of my life I never fully understood this feast. I never even knew that it was initially a Jewish feast, though if I had really been paying attention to the scripture readings for the day, I could have figured it out. The word Pentecost comes from the word fifty and in the Jewish tradition it is celebrated fifty days after Passover. It celebrates when Moses went up on Mount Sinai and received the Ten Commandments or the Torah. This was done fifty days after the first Passover. At that time God wrote his law on stone tablets and gave them to his people. At the Christian Feast of Pentecost, God writes his law on our hearts with tongues of fire. At the Pentecost celebrated almost two thousand years ago, the Holy Spirit descended onto 162 of Jesus' disciples who immediately started speaking in tongues. This reversed what God did at the tower of Babel when God dispersed the people because of their arrogance. At Pentecost he unites all peoples with a common language into his Church. Besides being the birthday of our Church, it also becomes the other bookend to our initiation into the Church. We start with Baptism and end with Confirmation. In fact, in the early Church, the Bishops normally would celebrate Confirmation on the Feast of Pentecost.

After every Cursillo weekend, we list the participants of the weekend in the Rooster Review. We start off listing the candidates who are now Babe Chicks, then list the team members and spiritual directors, and finally the all-important Holy Spirit as our honored guest. As we celebrate Pentecost, I ask that we all try to remember our own individual weekend and try to recall when and how you felt the Holy Spirit.

Message from the Central Virginia Cursillo Center Spiritual Director:

If you have never read the history of Cursillo and particularly its origins, you should do so soon. The beginning of Cursillo was in the ashes of Spanish society after their civil war, and the horrors of the Second World War. Spain and Spanish society was in ruins like the rest of Europe. Major cities looked like the pictures you see of Mariupol in the Ukraine today. Barely a stone left on stone.

Amid the physical and human rubble of those post-war years, the Holy Spirit was at work and she inspired a Catholic priest, a Bishop and a few rag-tag farmers, fisherman and young people to begin rebuilding Catholic life in Spain. Long story short (there are many versions on the web; e.g.; www.centralvacursillo.org) what we know as Cursillo was born and its mission is to transform the world for Christ. Those that have participated in a Cursillo know what sort of transformation that weekend experience can mean in their lives.

These days, we are undergoing a similar experience after tumultuous political confusion, a pandemic, and a new and so tragic war in Europe. Never has the world needed Cursillo more. But it seems after the fear and isolation of the pandemic, we seem to have forgotten what Cursillo can do. We desperately need to relearn how to hug each other and convince the world that the Love of God, manifest in our love for one another is something everyone needs to feel again. In Central Virginia, we have once again scheduled Cursillos for 2022 and 2023. We need to rebuild from the ground up and to do that we need new babe Chicks and the support of experienced Cursillistas to show the way.

Now is the time, and now is the moment to speak to your friend and neighbors, and family about this unique experience. Love one another. Be the disciples Jesus called us to be. The structures are all in place, we have a revised application and a reduced price for tuition. The banquet hall is ready, all we need are flesh and blood people open to the Spirit and not afraid to experience God's unconditional love just as the first Spaniards that stepped out and renewed the spiritual life in Spain and eventually in the world. Please come join us. We need you. Make a difference, be a sponsor. Let us set the world afire yet again.
